


Change Principle

The Person of Change 1 of 2

The Holy Spirit:

- One of three persons of the Godhead (Father, Son, Spirit)
- The agent who shows us our need of Christ and imparts Christ's life to us at salvation



The Person of Change 1 of 2

The Holy Spirit (cont.):

- Indwells us at the point of salvation
- Begins the work of changing our lives to become like Christ through <u>sanctification</u>
- He empowers us for service to Christ



We Must Cooperate

We are changed by the Holy Spirit as we cooperate with <u>His leading</u>.



Holy Spirit = Divine Leader

The Spirit of God is the divine leader whose convicting voice calls our attention to the times when we are intent on going our <u>own way</u>.

"He is the person of change."



He Leads Us

- Into an <u>understanding</u> of the Scriptures (Bible, Sermons, and other studies)
- Into "paths of righteousness" (Ps. 23:3) by which we reflect **Christ's likeness**



We Must Be Filled [Controlled]

Greek verb for filled

- God must <u>command</u> us to yield to the Holy Spirit's control (Done)
- Being controlled is an **ongoing** action
- Empowering is <u>done to</u> us when we choose to cooperate with Him



What is Filling [Controlling]

The supernatural work of the Spirit within a believer whereby that believer is enabled or empowered to become:

- Like Christ (Sanctification)
- Useful to Christ (Service).



To help us avoid falling into our old habits of sin:

- Turn to God at the first thought of temptation
- Stop and Pray immediately
 Tell God you believe His promises
- Move away from the temptation in some way



Actions to Take (cont.)

To help us avoid falling into our old habits of sin:

 Turn to God at the first thought of temptation (Yield to the Spirit)

If you entertain the idea of your old habit for any amount of time, you will likely give into it!



To help us avoid falling into our old habits of sin:

Stop and Pray immediately

"Jesus, I'm facing trouble right now, and I don't want to hurt my relationship with you. You want me to turn away from this temptation, and I want to listen to you."



To help us avoid falling into our old habits of sin:

Tell God you believe His promises

"You have told me that 'I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me' (Phil. 4:13). I believe your Word and am asking you for that strength to obey you right now."



To help us avoid falling into our old habits of sin:

Move away from the temptation in some way.

"Jesus, I think the wisest thing for me right now is to [leave the room, call my mentor, shut down my computer or phone, etc.], so that's what I am doing right now. Thank you for helping me obey You!"



Christian Life

"...first and foremost **about God**.

Christianity is primarily a relationship with the Creator, not merely a means to escape from everlasting torment or get deliverance from life-dominating sins or unsettling emotions"

Point of Salvation

When you accept Christ as your Savior (Romans 10:9–13), the Holy Spirit takes up residence in your heart, bringing with Him an entirely new life of love, relationship, and service to the Lord.



Christian Life

"Some suggest that the filling of the Holy Spirit is an emotional experience that takes place at certain moments, but the concept of 'filling' in Scripture is one of being controlled or influenced by the Holy Spirit.

At times living a Spirit-filled life may include emotional or mountain-top experiences. But the idea of being filled by the Spirit is more about an ongoing sense of God's Spirit working in a person's life, not a one-time experience.

As the believer lives out his or her faith in Christ, the Holy Spirit increasingly controls or fills his or her life; this leads to joy, thankfulness, and right relationships."

Holy Spirit in Scripture 1 of 2

As the Holy Spirit lives in the believer, He brings about some life-changing results:

- 1) The indwelling Spirit comes to a soul dead in sin and creates new life (Titus 3:5). This is the new birth Jesus spoke of in John 3:1–8.
- 2) The indwelling Spirit confirms to the believer that he belongs to the Lord and is an heir of God and fellow-heir with Christ (Romans 8:15–17).
- 3) The indwelling Spirit installs the new believer as a member of Christ's universal church. This is the baptism of the Spirit, according to 1 Corinthians 12:13.
- 4) The indwelling Spirit gives spiritual gifts (God-given abilities for service) to the believer to edify the church and serve the Lord effectively for His glory (1 Corinthians 12:11).
- 5) The indwelling Spirit helps the believer understand and apply the Scripture to his daily life (1 Corinthians 2:12).



Holy Spirit in Scripture 2 of 2

As the Holy Spirit lives in the believer, He brings about some life-changing results (cont.):

- 6) The indwelling Spirit enriches the believer's prayer life and intercedes for him in prayer (Romans 8:26–27).
- 7) The indwelling Holy Spirit empowers the yielded believer to live for Christ to do His will (<u>Galatians 5:16</u>). The Spirit leads the believer in paths of righteousness (<u>Romans 8:14</u>).
- 8) The indwelling Spirit gives evidence of new life by producing the fruit of the Spirit in the believer's life (<u>Galatians</u> 5:22-23).
- 9) The indwelling Spirit is grieved when the believer sins (<u>Ephesians 4:30</u>), and He convicts the believer to confess his sin to the Lord so that fellowship is restored (<u>1 John 1:9</u>).
- 10) The indwelling Spirit seals the believer unto the day of redemption so that the believer's arrival in the Lord's presence is guaranteed after this life (Ephesians 1:13-14).



Remember

God's recovery program is sanctification.

Yield your heart, soul, and mind to the Holy Spirt's control!
